- The time commitment involved
- Work or childcare arrangements
- Who will take the lead in supporting learning
- Financial considerations
- Whether you have a suitable space at home for learning activities

Your Child's Needs

It may also be helpful to reflect on:

- How your child prefers to learn
- Any sensory or emotional needs
- Their confidence around learning
- Whether they benefit from more time, repetition or flexibility
- Their interests and motivations

Lifestyle Changes

Home education often brings changes to family routines. You may wish to consider:

- Adjustments to your daily structure
- The level of flexibility you are comfortable with
- Opportunities to attend groups or activities
- Managing time between learning and other commitments

Family Readiness

You might also reflect on:

- How you feel about taking a more active role in your child's learning
- Whether you feel confident learning alongside your child
- What support networks you currently have in place
